White Wines

- 17 Col Baje, La Tunella, **Pinot Grigio**, Friuli Colli Orientali, DOP 34 136
La Tunella Col Baje Pinot Grigio is a classic wine using 100% Pinot Grigio grapes from the appellation Friuli Colli Orientali. It is slowly fermented using indigenous yeasts in stainless steel at 16 degrees Celsius for 30- 40 days. The Pinot Grigio is full bodied, moderately acidic with an intense bouquet of acacia blossom and ripe tropical fruit with subtle yeasty notes.
- 16 Gaja Ca'Marcanda, Vistamare, **Vermentino, Viognier, Fiano**, Toscana, IGT 47.5 190
The playful name of this wine (Vistamare, Italian for 'sea view') was inspired by the sea breeze, sun, and cheerful and light-hearted outlook of the Tuscan coast. Vistamare is a very limited production wine and the only white wine produced by the Ca' Marcanda estate, providing wine collectors with a true gem: Angelo Gaja's exclusive expression of Tuscan white wine. The wine has intense floral notes of acacia and linden flowers. The refreshing presence of Fiano gives notes of fern, musk and menthol. On the palate, it is fresh and compact with notes of bergamot, pear, nectarine and white currant. Then it shifts toward a more mineral and spicy character, with notes of flint, rosemary, saffron. The wine gets riper in the finish with hints of mango, almond and fig leaves.

Red Wines

- 13 Giuseppe Campagnola, **Amarone della Valpolicella**, Veneto, DOCG 46 185
A blend of Corvina and Corvinone Veronese 65% and Rondinella 35% grapes which have been naturally dried for up to 100 days to intensify flavour and body. The wine undergoes long maceration on skins and aged in oak barrels for up to 24 months. Powerful and intense bouquet, full bodied, cherry, ripe plum, toasted almond and Vanilla with a long finish.
- 13 **Barolo**, La Tradizione, Marchesi di Barolo, Piemonte, DOCG 50 199
Italy's "king of wines and wine for kings". Produced from the Nebbiolo grape in Piedmont delivering a full bodied rich wine with high tannins and complex aromas and flavours. Intense garnet red in colour with notes of cinnamon and spice, roses, cherry, tobacco and leather with firm tannins. Balanced and long finish.
- 10 Il Colle, **Brunello di Montalcino**, Toscana, DOCG 64 255
Arguably one of Italy's best wines produced in Tuscany from the Sangiovese Grosso grape variety. Aromas of dark berries, spice, leather and tobacco. Elegant and balanced on the palate displaying juicy Morello cherries, crushed raspberry, cinnamon and white pepper finishing with polished velvety tannins and fresh acidity.

Italian White Wine

Northern Italy

Piemonte

Piemonte is one of the top wine regions in Italy, cupped by the Alps of the north and the Apennines in the south. What makes Piedmont special is the combination of the ice cold Alps and the warm Mediterranean Sea which creates a high diurnal range, a tug of war in temperature, perfect conditions for the ripening of grapes.

Cortese is the grape of the most respected white wine 'Gavi', a dry white wine with lemon, white flower and mineral characteristics. Other grape varieties are the low acid Arneis with peach, pear, almond and floral characters and Favorita which is noted for its pear notes. Lastly the almost extinct Timorasso variety is a full bodied, rich and elegant wine.

Trentino-Alto Adige, Valle d'Aosta

Trentino-Alto Adige is the northernmost region positioned on the Austrian border. Although an Alpine region, on summer mornings the valley floor heats up sending warm air up into the vineyard lined slopes. This coupled with bright Alpine sunshine results in predominantly rich, ripe wine styles not expected in a cool region.

Veneto

Veneto produces more white wine than any other region in Italy. The world's most popular sparkling wine Prosecco, which is made from the Glera grape, is produced here.

Soave is the predominant white wine made from the Garganega grape variety with Trebbiano di Soave, Pinot Bianco and Chardonnay permitted to be added in small percentages. The "Classico" zone produces the best Soave as the vineyards are situated on volcanic slopes.

Central Italy

Toscana, Marche, Abruzzo, Liguria, Umbria, Lazio

The Central Italy wine region extends from the Adriatic Coast in the east to the Tyrrhenian Coast in the west. This region comprises diversified terroirs, with an abundance of sunshine, generous rainfall and variable climate.

Each region demonstrates its own unique characteristics and traits, Lazio with volcanic fertile hills, Marche is home to lemony mineral driven wines, Tuscany with rolling hills, Liguria with terraced slopes that almost fall into the sea and land-locked Umbria producing crisp and delicate fruit flavours.

Southern Italy

Basilicata, Campania, Molise, Puglia

Southern Italy has a rich winemaking heritage and is considered the birthplace of Italian wines. For thousands of years the wines here were much prized by the ancient Greeks and Romans. With an abundance of native grape varieties, Mediterranean climate and rich volcanic soils, Southern Italy is arguably Italy's most exciting and dynamic winemaking regions.

Sicilia, Sardegna

Sicily is the largest island in the Mediterranean and the southernmost wine region in Italy. There is a diverse landscape ranging from Trapani in the northwest exposed to the hot Saharan winds to the smoldering giant Mount Etna in the east, with plantings on soil rich with volcanic nutrients up to an altitude of 3,600 feet. Sicily's wine Renaissance began in the 1980's with the focus on producing elegant high quality wines.

Sardinia is the second largest Island in the Mediterranean and is situated 240km off the west coast of mainland Italy. The Mediterranean climate, of long hot dry summers and mild winters, together with the varying soils ranging from the granite belt in the north to the sandy soils in the south make this region unique and diverse. Vermentino is the star white wine here.

The wine shows minerals, florals, citrus and honey like characteristics depending on provenance.

Sauvignon Blanc is aromatic, refreshing, crisp and dry. Best grown in the Loire Valley, New Zealand and cooler regions of Australia. Aromas of green apple, gooseberry, elderflower, grapefruit and passionfruit along with herbaceous notes make this wine so distinctive and pleasant.

Chardonnay

Chardonnay is a special white wine as it is good at expressing the place it is grown and the influence of the winemaker. In cooler climates green apple, lemon, lime and mineral notes are displayed and in warmer regions fleshy fruits of peach, melon, pineapple and banana are prevalent. Chardonnay is open to a host of winemaking techniques such as oak maturation, lees contact and Malo-lactic fermentation which add complexity to the wine.

Rosé

This pink coloured wine can be made in one of three ways. The Saignee' method, which involves bleeding a portion of the red wine juice after being in contact with the skins for a short time. The direct pressing method, whereby the black grapes are crushed and the juice is separated from the skins immediately producing the lightest coloured rose's. The third method is blending a small amount of red wine to a white wine.

Our Rose selection contains wines from all three methods.

Veneto

Valpolicella is the most famous red wine district of Veneto's wine region. Corvina is the main grape variety which is blended to create wines which have a mild fruity flavour with hints of almond.

Valpolicella Ripasso is produced by adding the just pressed lees of Amarone skins to the Valpolicella wine to add body and flavour to the wine.

Amarone della Valpolicella

This is a blended wine using primarily Corvina grapes with a small percentage of Rondinella, Molinara, Corvinone and Oselata also allowed. The Amarone style developed as winemakers searched for a way to increase body, complexity and alcohol of their wines.

Ripe grapes are handpicked in whole bunches and undergo the "appassimento" method whereby they are left to dry traditionally on straw mats for up to 3 months in the "fruttaio". The grapes lose a high percentage of water content intensifying the sugars and flavours as well as increasing the ratio of skin contact to juice during the slow pressing and fermentation process. The wine is aged for a minimum of 2 years but generally it is not released till after 5 years. The result is a full bodied, full flavoured dry wine with power, strong hints of dried fruits, spice, raisins and chocolate.

Trentino-Alto Adige, Valle d'Aosta, Lombardia, Friuli Venezia Giulia

This area is home to the native variety of Lagrein which is full bodied with flavours of dark plum and wild cherries, firm tannins and deep dense colour. International varieties such as Pinot Noir and Merlot shine in this region.

Piemonte

Piemonte, translated as 'foot of the mountain', is often described as the Burgundy of Italy due to the large number of small scale family wineries focusing on quality. Piemonte's star red grape is Nebbiolo, Italy's greatest noble grape. The two small villages of Barolo and Barbaresco produce some of Italy's greatest wines.

The Barbera grape grown in the towns of Asti and Alba delivers a deeply coloured, low tannin, high acidic wine with sour cherry, strawberry, plum and blackberry notes. Dolcetto is an earlier ripening variety producing a fuller bodied, low in acid acid and high in tannin wine with blueberry, black currant and violet flavours.

Barolo

“The Wine of King’s, The King of Wines”

Made from the Nebbiolo grape, a slow ripening variety which delivers perfumes of roses, sour cherries, herbs, dried flowers, liquorice, mint, cassis and spice. Tannins are a trademark of these wines and ageing softens these as well as adding complexities such as tar, leather, truffles and tobacco. Barolo is produced in mainly five communes which all surround the town of the same name. The Barolo zone can be divided into two valleys. Serralunga valley to the east which includes the commons of Castiglione Falletto, Monforte d’Alba and Serralunga d’Alba and to the west of the divide lies the communes of La Morra and Barolo regions.

The sandstone soils of Monforte d’Alba and Serralunga d’Alba produce a broader more intense structured wine with firmer tannins, darker fruits and and take longer to mature.

The calcareous marl soils of Barolo and La Morra deliver a softer, aromatic, elegant and fruity wine which develops sooner. The Castiglione Falletto is located on the spur of the two valleys with overlapping soil types. These wines have the aromatics typical of the Barolo commune with the structure of the Serralunga d’Alba style wine.

Barolo must be aged for a minimum of 3 years with at least 18 months in wood casks.

Barbaresco

Barbaresco is a wine made from the Nebbiolo grape in the Langhe region of Piedmont from the communes of Barbaresco, Neive, Treiso and San Rocco Seno d’Elvio. Whilst the flavour profiles are similar to that of Barolo, the softer tannins, elegance and aromatics make Barbaresco a very special wine. Aged for a minimum of 26 months with a minimum of 9 months in oak.

Toscana

Chianti

Chianti is located in the foothills of the Appenines between the cities of Pisa, Florence and Siena. Sangiovese is the dominant grape variety but the wines are allowed to be blended with small amounts of other grapes.

Chianti DOCG region is subdivided into seven sub-zones. Chianti Classico has its own DOCG. Its vineyards are at higher altitudes, slowing the ripening process and resulting in wines that are complex, tannic and savoury. Chianti Grand Selezione must be aged sourced from a single estate and aged for a minimum of 30 months.

Super Tuscan

In the 1970's Tuscan winemakers Piero Antinori (creator of Tiganello) and Mario Incisa (creator of Sassicaia in Bolgheri) believed that the rules governing the production of Chianti were too restrictive. They started to produce wines that were made from non-indigenous grape varieties planted in Tuscany such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah. These wines gained a cult like status as they soon produced some of the best wine in Tuscany.

Sicilia, Sardegna

Sicily has now transformed itself into one of the most respected wine making regions of Italy, focusing on quality and not quantity. Nero d'Avola is the signature grape variety along with indigenous varieties from the slopes of Mount Etna such as Nerello Mascalese and Nerello Cappuccio.

The primary red grape in Sardinia is Cannonau. Originally it was thought to have been a clone of the French Grenache or Spanish Garnacha grape, but recent findings have confirmed that it is a native to the Island. Cannonau is a full bodied wine with medium alcohol, soft acidity, red fruit flavours with spicy and floral notes. Carignano del Sulcis is the king grape variety grown on old bush vines in the south of the Island.

Pinot Noir

Pinot Noir is a delicate grape variety extremely sensitive to terroir, vine grower and maker, but when treated right produces one of the most complex and elegant light to medium bodied wines with soft tannins. Distinct regional styles display the varieties diversity from vibrant red fruit characters to complex earthy and savoury expressions.

Australia and New Zealand are part of the New World in winemaking production in which the style of Pinot Noir is riper, fruitier, less acidic and fresher.

The ancestral home of Pinot Noir is Burgundy located in central-eastern France. This Old World style of wine is completely influenced by terroir. These wines are earth driven whilst showing complexity and finesse not found in any other region.

Shiraz

The thick skinned grape of Shiraz produces an array of styles and expressions depending on the region, soil and micro climate. Styles of Shiraz can range from medium bodied peppery, black fruits to full bodied intense very ripe black fruits with smooth tannins and chocolate aromas. The Barossa Valley is the spiritual home of Shiraz in Australia, with some of the oldest vines in the world, delivering intensely flavoured, rich and earthy wines.

The Rhone Valley is the natural home of Syrah, also known as Shiraz. The wines produced here are Old World style which is more complex, slightly leaner in body than Australian Shiraz, earthy and with softer tannins.

Cabernet

Believed to have originated in France, Cabernet Sauvignon is a crossing of Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon Blanc. This variety displays an abundance of flavour, colour and tannin.

Typical characteristics of Cabernet Sauvignon are blackcurrant, plum, cedar and mint.

Bordeaux is where this variety really shines and is usually blended with Merlot and Cabernet Franc to add complexity and structure to the wine.
